

Workshop on Frequency Management February 11-13, 2004

The workshop was organised for MCTI (Ministry of Communications and IT) and IGCTI (General Inspectorate for Communications and IT) staff members.

The opening of the training was made by the Minister, Mr. Dan Nica, who addressed the audience by presenting the purpose of the training and by emphasizing the expectations the Minister had from the participants in acquiring knowledge and information to be used further on in their activity. He was followed by Mr. Jerker Torngren who said a few words about the the course, its scope and its organisation and by Mr. Shah who introduced himself to the audience.

The subjects touched by Mr. Shah covered a large range from basic elements for wireless communications to spectrum issues, broadcast systems, cellular systems, wireless LAN, 3G standards, fixed wireless systems, wireless local loop, network economics and sharing and new services and solutions beyond 3G.



The participants in the course had different ages and backgrounds; some of them had a technical education in electronics and communications, others had a legal education or had studied public administration and public relations. Mr. Shah's task was not, therefore, a very easy one, as his presentation had to be clear enough and include some basic elements but also technical enough for the more experienced participants. Judging by the reactions of the audience he succeeded very well in this task.
