The General Accounting Office (GAO) made available to the Romanian delegation reports on US E-govt issues such as Collaboration Practices in e-Government, Most Recent PKI Technology Study, OMB Selection and Implementation Report of Quicksilver projects.

At the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), one of many issues of interest for the Romanian delegation was related to the indicators OMB uses to measure the e-govt projects: cost, schedule and performance and the Public-Private.
